Drom National School Junior Infants 2018 - 2019



PARENTAL CONCERNS

CROKE PARK HOURS

The provisions of the Croke Park Public Service Agreement provides for an additional 36 hours per school year per teacher at primary level. The Board of Management of Drom National School designates the use of the 36 hours to provide additional time to deal with the following items: school planning, professional development, staff meetings and pre-school supervision.

HANDY TIPS!

- As we approach winter, we would ask that all students bring a coat to school.
 With our unpredictable weather, we must prepare for all eventualities.
- We would ask parents / guardians of children with extra care needs regarding
 the toilet to provide them with a small bag containing a change of clothing
 (Similar in colour to the school uniform) including underwear and socks. This
 will be stored in the classroom and can be accessed by the child in case of an
 accident. In this way, the child is comfortable in their own clothing.
- In order to ensure the safety of the children, please leave a space for the bus to park outside the school bus gate.
- In Term 1, the children take part in Gaelic Football training. We would ask that children bring a pair of old runners or studded boats to school for training along with a spare pair of socks and gum shields.
- The school will open to receive pupils at 9.20a.m. and close at 3.00p.m. Children
 are supervised in the school grounds between 9.10a.m. and 9.20a.m. <u>THE</u>
