

Texaco Art Competition



We now invite entries for the Texaco Art Competition. Hereunder is some information for your attention should your child be interested in taking part: Subject

One of the most interesting things about art is its diversity. That's why your child's entry to the Competition can be about anything that interests them.

Size of artwork

Entries should not be smaller than **A4 (29.7cm x 21.0cm)** or larger than **A2 (59.4cm x 42.0cm)** before it is mounted, which is optional. Please submit any artwork in flat format only. It should not be rolled, folded or framed.

Use of Materials

The children may use any type of paper, white, coloured, rough or smooth. The work that they submit may be drawn or painted in pencil, charcoal, pen and ink, crayon, pastel, watercolour, gouache, acrylics, oils, poster colour and collage. Alternatively, it may be a print created from a lino block, wood block or any other method, and the artwork may be submitted on canvas.

Only digitally produced works using any artwork software may be submitted to the Competition by email at texacochildrensart@valero.com. A photograph or scanned image of an original artwork will not be considered under any circumstances.

Originality

Your child's work should be original and unaided. Children should not copy another person's work. Any source imagery must be indicated at time of entry. Failure to properly reference any source imagery may result in disqualification.

Number of Entries

Children may submit up to two entries each, but each entry must have its own completed Application Form securely attached to it.

COMPLETED ENTRIES SHOULD BE SENT TO THE SCHOOL PRIOR TO WEDNESDAY, 19th FEBRUARY 2020.

SAFER INTERNET DAY

Safer Internet Day is an EU wide initiative to promote a safer internet for all users, especially young people. Here are some tips from Webwise.ie

1. Talk about Internet Safety with your Child

Have a conversation with your child on some of the important things to watch out for when going online for the first time. Young children will not be aware of the dangers, so it is very important to have a talk about who they talk to online and about sharing personal information online.

2. Use Parental Controls

Most internet technologies have built-in controls that allow you to limit the amount of time your child can spend online, restrict their access to adult content, and switch off functions like shopping and chatting. Filtering controls are particularly useful at preventing young children from accidentally encountering content that might bother them.

3. Disable In-App Purchases

Many apps and games offer in-app purchases giving user's additional game functionality, additional points/bonuses which children can easily purchase without even realising. You can switch off in-app purchases using your phone/device settings.

4. Activate Safe Search

Help minimise the risk of your child coming across inappropriate content in response to search queries by activating safe search in your search engine.

5. Agree on what to do when things go wrong

We recommend that you speak to your child about what to do if they come across something on the internet that bothers them. This could involve closing the laptop lid, or turning off the screen, and coming to get you.

This comes in handy in particular when it comes to memes or Internet "challenges" that may pass parents by. Instilling this practice in your children will help you keep them safe.

6. Set Up a Family Email

Set up a family email address that your children can use when signing up to new games and websites online.

7. Play it Safe

For young children, we would recommend parents choose safe and appropriate games for their child to play online. Most games should have a PEGI rating to allow parents to check if they are age appropriate. Parents should also check if a game allows for player interaction and if there is a safe chat mode.

Confirmation Retreat

On Monday, 20th January 2020, the students of 5th and 6th Class attended a Confirmation retreat in Holycross Abbey. The children explored the Sacrament of Confirmation and learned about the Gifts and Fruits of the Holy Spirit. They explored how they could display the Fruits of the Holy Spirit in their lives and wrote prayers to help them on their journey to becoming adult members of the church. We thank Father Murphy for organising this worthwhile and enjoyable day.

Service of Light & Commitment Ceremony

On Thursday, 27th February 2020, the 5th & 6th class students of Drom National School will attend a Service of Light and Commitment ceremony in St. Mary's Church, Drom at 7pm. They will be joined by the students of Barnane NS and Inch NS at this special ceremony.

During the Service of Light, parents will pass their child's baptismal candle to them as a sign that they are passing their Christian faith on to them.

In the Commitment ceremony, the children will present to the Lord, the ways in which they have chosen to grow in their relationship with God as they prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation.
