SCIENCE WEEK

Science Week took place from 7th – 14th November. This week saw us explore physics, biology and chemistry through a series of fun and exciting activities in each class.

Ms. Bulter's Class explored osmosis using Jelly Babies. They placed Jelly Babies in a jar of water and watched in wonder as the water in the glass flowed through the Jelly Babies' semi-permeable membranes to make the Jelly Babies grow.





Ms. Moore-Walsh's class gave Einstein a run for his money with a plethora of activities for Science Week. On Monday, the children explored how soap molecules in washing up liquid will bond to fat molecules and remove them from our dishes. Tuesday saw them learn how to bend light and make their drawings dance on water. On Wednesday, the children made Oobleck, a substance that can mimic the qualities of a solid as well as a liquid depending on the pressure that you apply to it. Thursday saw the children of Second and Third Class take part in a Zoom workshop called Planet Science in association with Tipperary Festival of Science where they explored mixing an acid and a base and made 'Candy' DNA. Friday saw the children explore electricity further by learning about materials which conducted electricity and those materials which were insulators. The children learned that all metals conduct electricity but that some metals are better conductors than others.

SCIENCE WEEK

Not to be outdone, Ms. Dervan's class doned their lab coats and goggles and enjoyed a jam-packed week of science experiments for Science Week also. The class kicked off Science Week in style with a super live class with Múinteoir John from RTE's Home School Hub. Tuesday saw them design and build their 'Future School' using Lego and materials found in the local natural environment. They also engaged in a 'mind boggler' activity which saw the left and right side of their brain do battle. They had great fun on Wednesday experimenting with bubbles as they learned all about mixing liquids, air pressure and forces. The Planet Science workshop was also enjoyed by Ms. Dervan's class on Thursday, while Friday saw them save the best until last with a kaleidoscope of different activities to round off the week including taking part in a Zoom quiz with PH!L of Science, alongside thousands of other primary school children. A whole host of STEM challenges were then undertaken including making the tallest tower, the longest paper chain and even marshmallow catapults were constructed! The experiments got even sweeter as they examined forces by moving maltesers before using the power of air to hold themselves up! I think next year, we will have to explore the science of sleep after that tremendously busy week!!!
