Drom NS celebrated Friendship Week from 7th to 11th November. As part of Friendship Week, the children made a Friendship Tree. They asked for a friend to do something kind for them such as get their coat at home time, help them with a subject they found difficult or let them choose the game that would be played at lunchtime.

They also made a Friendship Paper Chain with the qualities of a good friend written on each part of the chain.

The children learned about the qualities of a good friend, about bullying and about what to do it they were being bullied or witnessed someone being bullied.

They listed the five people that would give them a 'Helping Hand' if they thought they were being bullied, while senior students (Third to Sixth Class) took part in an anonymous survey on the topic of bullying.

Of course, the highlight of Friendship Week is when the younger children meet their 'Senior Friendship Week Buddy' and enjoy playing with them. The children couldn't wait to get to know their 'Friendship Week Pal' and had great fun playing with them during lunch times.

SCIENCE WEEK

Science Week took place from 13th – 20th November. The week saw us explore physics, biology and chemistry through a series of fun and exciting activities in each class.

Junior Infants, Senior Infants and First Class had great Science fun as they watched the cool results of their Magic Milk Science Experiment when they dipped soap covered cotton buds into the milk and food colouring mixture. How cool are the designs they created.



Second & Third Class sought to outdo the awesome Science week they had last year with this year's Science Week activities. On Monday, the children looked at what plants need to grow. They placed celery in different coloured water to examine how water travels in plants They learned that the "vessels" in the celery stalks carry the water and colour to the leaves, like the way blood travels through your body.

Tuesday saw the children make 'Milk Plastic'. They examined how materials change when something is added to them or heat is applied. They separated milk into curds and whey and then used the curds to make decorations. Stinky but great fun!

On Wednesday, the children of Second & Third class learned all about the density of different liquids. They learned that density is the amount of parts in the same space. Think of a drawer full of socks. It has a certain density. But when you take some socks out it becomes less dense. The drawer is the same but there are less parts in it. The children measured out the same amount of different liquids and put them in a jar. Those that were more dense sank and those that were less dense floated on top. Honey was the most dense liquid, while oil was the least!

On Thursday, the children were challenged to create a catapult from simple materials and then test their catapults to see which could launch a projectile furthest. While Ms. Scanlan may have had to duck for cover on more than a few occasions, the children had a ball creating and testing their catapults.

You would think the children would have had enough by Friday ... but not the super scientists of Second & Third Class. The children started the day by taking part in a webinar where they looked at the science of milk and then made CD hovercrafts in the afternoon.

Move over Einstein, there is a new group ready to set the world of Science on fire!



If you thought Second and Third Class were busy, then check out what Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Class got up to for Science Week.

On Monday, the children created a Science Week word bank. Tuesday and Wednesday saw them experiment with pressure using balloons and thumb tacks. They learned that one thumbtack can obviously pop a balloon with little force, but a bed of thumbtacks do not because the force is spread out among all of the thumbtacks so the pressure exerted by any individual thumbtack is not sufficient to pop the balloon.

Thursday saw Ms. Dervan's class engage in a 'Super Sound' experiment. The children experimented with sound waves by using humming to make sprinkles dance on a piece of cling film placed over a bowl.

Friday couldn't have been greater fun as the children were challenged to create a car from Lego that could protect their egg passenger.

We would like to say that no eggs were harmed in the course of this challenge but unfortunately, that would be wishful thinking!!! Nonetheless, the children had egg-cellent fun along the way.

As if this wasn't enough to keep the children going, they also engaged in a number of webinars and projects throughout Science Week.

Like Ms. Moore-Walsh's room, Fourth, Fifth & Sixth took part in 'The Magic of Milk' webinar from Teagasc. They also took part in a webinar where they learned all about the different branches of science.

Throughout the week, they engaged in a number of projects including a project about a scientist of their choice and one which involved them researching about the different branches of science. Watch out world. The future is bright with all these smart scientists from Drom NS.
