SPACE WEEK

Space Week is Ireland's newest national STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) week. It takes place each year between the 4th and 10th of October. This week, during Space Week, the people of Ireland were asked to focus on the theme of 'Our Planet, Our Space, Our Time.'

Here in Drom National School, we celebrated Space Week by learning about space, creating art projects, engaging in spaced themed engineering tasks and taking part in our first Microsoft Dreamspace LIVE event.

In the Junior room, the children learned the song 'Eight Planets', which helped them to learn the names of the planets and a little about each of them. They then donned their astronaut helmets and created a paper plate spaceship to carry them on a space adventure where no (wo)man has gone before!

In the Middle room, the children created clay aliens – with one alien proudly supporting the Drom and Inch Camogie team by wearing green and red! Who knew that our mighty heroes had such wide-ranging support? The children of First, Second & Third Class also designed rockets and used the power of air to propel them forward. Great fun was had determining which rocket could travel the furthest.

The Senior room took part in their first LIVE Microsoft Dreamspace Event for Space Week as part of the Microsoft Dreamspace Ambassador program that the school is taking part in this year. With the help of the Microsoft Dreamspace team, they learned how to design a space-themed game on the computer using Microsoft MakeCode Arcade. We reckon it won't be long before they steal the limelight from the Collison brothers as billionaire computer geniuses from Co. Tipperary.

MATHS WEEK

Maths Week Ireland took place from October 14th – 22nd and involved a wide range of mathematical activities and events for young and old throughout the island of Ireland. Maths Week Ireland is organised by Calmast in the Waterford Institute of Technology and is designed to highlight the benefits of mathematical thinking and the opportunities this creates for students, society and the economy.

Here, in Drom National School, we had a hugely enjoyable and busy Maths Week in each class.

The Junior Room had a jam-packed week of activities to celebrate Maths Week starting with Pumpkin Ring Toss. The children practised their counting and comparing skills as they tried to toss a hula hoop around a variety of different sized pumpkins. This was followed by a game of Ghost Bowling where the children had to knock 'ghost' toilet rolls down and add together their scores from each round. Then, our Incredible Infants engaged in some shape art creating a witch and a haunted house from 2-D shapes. They ended the week by taking part in a Maths Week event organised by the Microsoft Dreamspace Ambassador team. The ambassadors helped the children to create and test their pattern making skills by coding a pattern on the micro:bit computer using the Microsoft MakeCode website.

From mathematical games to a table quiz and a very puzzling brainteaser from the principal to solve, a super week was had by all in Ms. Kirwan's room for Maths Week. For their Microsoft Dreamspace Ambassador event, the children of First, Second and Third Class coded virtual dice. They then used these to play the PIG game. The Senior Room also took part in the Maths Week table quiz, ably organised by Ms. Kirwan. Not only that, but they also took part in an event organised by the Dreamspace Ambassadors team. 
