SPACE WEEK

World Space Week, celebrated from October 4th to October 10th each year, is a special time when people all over the world come together to celebrate the wonders of space! It's an opportunity to learn about amazing things like planets, stars, rockets, and space exploration.

Schools and space organizations hold fun activities to teach children how astronauts travel to space, how scientists study the universe, and why space is important for our future. It's a week to get excited about discovering new things about our solar system and beyond!

In the Junior and Senior Infant classes, the children celebrated Space Week by learning a song called The Eight Planets, where they memorized the names of the planets in our Solar System. They also enjoyed listening to a space themed story called Back to Earth with a Bump. With their love for arts and crafts, they made beautiful galaxy artwork to mark the special occasion. The Mighty Middle Class also had a blast celebrating Space Week with an exciting array of activities. They explored each planet through creative projects and dove into art and crafts inspired by the wonders of our solar system. The week wrapped up with an interactive space-themed quiz, making the learning truly out of this world!

MATHS WEEK

Maths Week Ireland is a national event that celebrates math in a fun and engaging way. It happens every October and is aimed at getting people of all ages, especially students, interested in math. Schools, colleges, libraries, and community groups across Ireland take part in various activities like math puzzles, games, workshops, and talks to show how math is important in everyday life and can be enjoyable to learn. The goal is to help everyone, from young kids to adults, feel more confident about math and to see it as something useful and exciting, not just a school subject. It's a week full of fun challenges, interactive events, and opportunities to explore math in new ways!

In the Infant classroom, students had a week filled with exciting math activities! On Monday, they explored patterns by helping a teacher distribute Halloween treats in a specific sequence to 20 students. Tuesday brought a creative twist as they crafted "wicked witches" using a variety of 2-D shapes. On Wednesday, they played Pumpkin Ring Toss, where they added the numbers on each pumpkin to find the top scorer from three successful throws. Thursday's challenge required logic as they competed to pick the last apple from a group of 10 bobbing in the witch's cauldron, with the rule that they could only pick apples in sets of 1 or 2—a true brain teaser! The week wrapped up with a round of the always-popular Ghost Bowling with Ms. Power, ending on a spooky high note!

In the Middle Room, students tackled the Maths Week quiz booklets daily, sharpening their skills with each challenge. They also enjoyed a more advanced version of Ghost Bowling, where they added up numbers from 1 to 12 on the ghost pins to calculate their total score. Additionally, they played a variety of educational games from the Topmarks website, blending learning with fun!

The Senior Smarties were fully engaged in celebrating Maths Week! They embraced the new Primary Maths Curriculum by diving into a series of open-ended tasks from the Oide website, a newly launched resource funded by the Department of Education to support teachers and school leaders. This innovative approach made Maths Week both challenging and rewarding for the students, sparking curiosity and enhancing their problem-solving skills.

FRIENDSHIP WEEK

Each year at Drom National School, we celebrate Friendship Week as part of our commitment to building a strong sense of community and supporting our anti-bullying policy.

During Friendship Week, students explore the qualities of being a good friend and reflect on moments when they may not have been as kind as they could be.

A central focus is placed on understanding bullying and knowing how to respond if a child is bullied or witnesses bullying.

In the Infant Room, the children learned about the qualities of a good friend by playing a game where they identified friendly and unfriendly actions.

The Mighty Middle Class took a proactive approach, creating posters on how to be a good friend and identifying five trusted people they could turn to for support if they experienced bullying. They also explored a friendship-themed poem and made friendship bracelets and cards, reinforcing the value of kindness and empathy.

In the Senior Room, students delved into the topic of cyberbullying and discussed strategies to handle it responsibly.

During Friendship Week, Junior students (Infants to Second Class) also got to meet their Senior buddies (Third to Sixth Class) for the first time. These Senior buddies played with their Junior companions throughout the week and will continue to be there for them throughout the year, providing a helping hand during break times if needed.

Special congratulations to Tom Cahill, who was named Senior Buddy Champion for Friendship Week 2024. Tom went above and beyond each day to look after and play with his Junior Buddy, Michael Kennedy, embodying the spirit of friendship and support.

Indeed, all Senior students deserve recognition for the kindness and care they showed to their younger companions, making us proud as a school community to witness such responsibility and compassion among our students.






